

CLINICAL MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING, POST- MASTER’S CERTIFICATE

This 15-credit post-master’s certificate is designed to prepare counselors and other human services professionals for specialized areas of practice through the provision of advanced preparation and supervised experience. It is also intended for students who need to complete the academic requirements for licensure as clinical professional counselors.

Admission Requirements

Applicants are required to have completed a master’s degree in counseling or a related field from an accredited institution of higher education and submit official transcripts from all accredited post-secondary institutions attended, a statement of personal and career goals, a detailed résumé or curriculum vitae, dispositions survey, and two letters of recommendation.

Note: Letters are not required for students currently enrolled in the School of Education’s Clinical Mental Health Counseling or School Counseling master’s programs.

Program Requirements

Students develop individualized programs of study with specialized concentrations in consultation with their faculty adviser. The program must be completed within three years.
